Exit Feedback Analysis Report YEAR 2019-20

The survey was conducted as continuous basis. The feedback survey was done including different stakeholders like students, faculty, employer, alumni and parent.

- Special Faculty discussion on draft document
- ➢ Focus group discussion on time to time basis.


Survey was conducted by the help of collecting different feedback forms. A total of 225 responses were collected though survey. From a total of 225 respondents, 171 were students, 19 were alumni and 15 were employer and 20 parents. The questionnaires are quantitative in nature. The survey included questions related to their association with GNIPST and questions pertaining to the draft strategy document.


Each of the stakeholders had different views on different survey tool. In student survey, the questionnaire was asked to the currently enrolled under-graduates about their course content, teaching-learning process and onto their Institutional facilities.

The alumni survey instrument was designed to ask the former students about their opinion related to the survey question and view related to the development of GNIPST. They have given their feedback on PEO, PO and onto the general facilities given in college

Summary of Exit survey:

Final year students of GNIPST are one of the important stakeholders. For the improvement of the Institution the final year students provided their valuable feedback. By summarizing all the quantitative question it was revealed that they completely agree with the mission, vision statement of our Institute. They also agreed that the curriculum strongly build a link between the Institute and the society. While expressing their view on the career guidance and counselling as well as placement cell, 97% of them agreed that ample on campus and off campus opportunities were provided.

- The collected report clearly indicates that 91% of students are very much satisfied with the PO statements. As per the opinion of the final year students Employer, communication skill (general) of the students is quite good considering the other parameter like problem solving ability and decision-making skill.
- □ Area of improvement is the interpersonal (professional level) skills of students.
- □ 97% of them agreed that ample on campus and off campus opportunities were provided.
- More than 90% of the students have given positive feedback on different parameters of PO statement.

Action Taken

In view of identifying the gap in the syllabus as per the requirement of various stakeholders, the college has taken feedback on course curriculum from the students. Suggestions like more smart and experiential leaning and approach to competitive exams, relevant to the framing of the syllabus of various courses were consolidated and discussed.

As suggested by IQAC following actions were prominently taken

1. More guidance lectures were conducted.

2. Students are made aware of these facilities during Orientation Programs in the beginning.

3. More of industrial visits and field visits are conducted now. Also teachers are asked to undertake more experiential teaching learning process. Teachers are also using Flip learning for enhancing teaching learning experience.

4. Expert guidance lectures are conducted on different topics of advanced sciences to inculcate interest in subjects.

5. Extension activities for social and environment sensitization are conducted.
